Psalms Session 2 - Hymns (Songs of Praise)

Welcome/Prayer (Psalm 113)

Hymns

Hymns are songs of praise. They reveal what the psalmist feels when the relationship with God is tranquil.

Examples include Psalms 8; 19; 29; 33; 104; 105; 111; 113; 114; 117; 135; 136; 145-150.

Reading and Discussion

Select 2 or 3 of the psalms listed above. Read them aloud.

Share your insights and general reactions to the selected psalms. You may wish to use the following questions as points of discussion.

- 1. What would you say is the basic message of the psalm?
- 2. When in your life have you found the psalm most meaningful?
- 3. What made you select this particular psalm to share?

Read the following scriptures:

Reader 1 - Psalm 107:1-9

Reader 2 - Psalm 107:10-16

Reader 3 – Psalm 107:17-22

Reader 4 – Psalm 107:23-32

Reader 5 - Psalm 107: 33-43

Reader 6 - Romans 11:33-36

Reflect on the above passages from the Psalm and Romans, particularly the various dimensions of God's grace described and celebrated.

- 1. What does grace (kindness, mercy) look like in the Psalm? Romans?
- 2. What aspects of God's character have you glimpsed in the Psalm?
- 3. In what ways does this psalm stretch your own understanding of God?

Read Psalms 149; 150

In Psalms 149 and 150, the Hebrew phrase for "praise the Lord" is Hallelu Yah.

- 1. Share a hallelujah moment in your life.
- 2. Which of the following features in nature characterizes where you are in your walk of faith and why?
